The Chapel of the High-Speed Pass will officially recognize February 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019 and in future years as "Four Chaplains" day where the photos and bios of the Four Chaplains will be on display effective with the official opening of the Chapel of the High-Speed Pass. These Four Army Chaplains gave up their life jackets on the deck of the sinking U.S.A.T. Dorchester in the North Atlantic in 1943. All four chaplains were awarded the Army DSC, Secord Highest Decoration for Bravery, and Purple Heart. They are still listed on the DPAA (Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency) as unaccounted for. They were also awarded the Chaplain's Medal for Heroism in 1961. The Four Chaplains are the only recipients of the award since it was established in 1960. The Four Chaplains are listed below:
